Over the last few months, I have shared highlights from the "Foundations, Strengths and Possibilities" workshop led by Pastor John Wertz, Assistant to the VA Synod Bishop, in October. Christ Lutheran participants engaged in lively conversation about who we are as a congregation and who we hope to become. We have been throughout our history and continue to be a community of care and service grounded in faithful worship.

The final topic of conversation in the workshop was about looking ahead. How might God use our foundations and strengths to grow Christ Lutheran's ministries into the future? We talked about growing our intentional intergenerational ministries as well as learning to better connect with children, youth and families specifically. One group spent time talking about reaching out to the families in our congregation and in our neighborhood to determine how we can meet real needs.

Beginning in February, Christ Lutheran Church will have the opportunity to participate in the ELCA's Congregations Lead Initiative, along with four other Virginia Synod congregations. A group of our members will learn about innovation, design a project based on community needs, implement the project, and evaluate it with the help of the ELCA Innovation Lab. 

FINANCIAL REPORT

January 2025 Financial Report:

As we approach the end of the calendar and budget year we would like to thank you again for your financial giving in support of our church. However, as I imagine you are aware, during 2024 giving was less than anticipated and expenses were more than anticipated. Fortunately, October and November were strong months for contributions and December looks promising as well. This will help narrow our deficit. Reserve funds were needed this year and while we are blessed to have those, we know we cannot rely on that source indefinitely. Some of our invested/reserve funds are designated for specific purposes, and in addition, we know that the future holds some very expensive repairs to include a new roof and repairs to stained glass windows. We will benefit from having these additional reserve funds when that day does come.

For 2025 our operating budget is \$480,836, significantly lower than this year. Provided we don't have extensive unforeseen bills, and with your continued generous giving we should be in much better shape in 2025. And remember, if you have not pledged for 2025 it is not too late!
