## PASTOR CINDY'S NOTE

"The season of Easter is the season of celebration. Christ is risen! Death is conquered! Let all the people worship the Lord! Many Christians assume that Easter is just one day. In fact, the church celebrates Easter for fifty days. During this season it remembers the postresurrection appearances of Christ, it celebrates Christ's ascension into heaven, the coming of the Spirit on Pentecost, and begins to explore the implications of the Resurrection for the future of God's kingdom" (<u>The</u> <u>Complete Library of Christian Worship</u>, "Introduction to the Season of Easter," p. 371-373).

As followers of Jesus, we are an Easter people! We praise God for Christ's life. We give thanks to Jesus for his death for us and for the world. We celebrate our Lord's resurrection not just on Easter day, not just during the fifty days of Easter, but every day! We celebrate the good news – because Christ lives, we will live also (John 14:19)!

Of course, life doesn't often feel like a celebration. The world and our lives are chaotic, difficult, challenging, even scary. You don't need me to tell you that. Sickness, grief, financial concerns, politics, violence, suffering abound... The good news of Easter is that none of those things, including death, get to have the last word. *Christ is risen. Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!* In the face of all the suffering and death the world has to offer, we have hope. We have hope for new life, eternal life, abundant life even now. Because Christ lives, we shall live also!

Friends in Christ, this is GOOD NEWS! And good news is meant to be shared. This gospel is meant to be lived. The gospel is not just for me or for us, but for the world. Even (no, especially) in difficult days, we live the Easter gospel by working for peace and justice wherever we can, in whatever ways we can. I'd love to talk with you about how our congregation might continue and grow in our service to others in the coming months and years.

*Christ is risen. Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!* Thank you for your faithful witness and for your partnership in the gospel!



## FINANCIAL REPORT

May 2025 Financial Report:

Please refer to the table below for the most recent monthly income and expense data that is available. Through the first quarter of the year giving has kept pace with expenditure, which is fantastic! Thank you!

Our review of the church's insurance coverage is continuing. Additional questions have been raised, but this process should certainly be completed by the May Council meeting.

The Finance Committee met with our Wells Fargo advisors in late March. The portfolio has had somewhat of a downturn recently but overall has netted 8.61% since inception. For the whole of 2024 it was up 9.52%. As you are aware the market declined sharply at the end of March and beginning of April. This will be reflected in our portfolio balance.

The audit team will be needing new members next year. If you would like to join the team and learn about the process you are more than welcome. No experience is necessary!
